A word that is the *same* or *almost the same* as an English word



librairie = bookshop





An adverb used to give **emphasis**



CONJUGATE

To change a verb depending on **who** is doing the action or **when** it's being done

e.g. Conjugate the verb "manger" in the past tense:

j'ai mangé - I ate

nous avons mangé - we ate

tu as mangé - You ate

vous avez mangé - you lot ate

il a mangé - He ate

ils ont mangé - they ate
