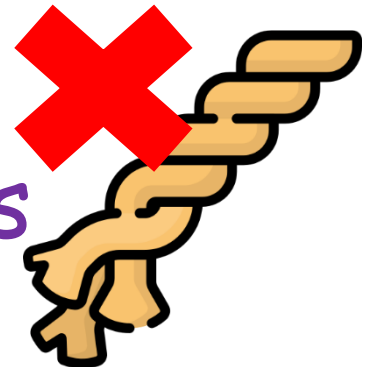
FALSE FRIEND

CONJUGATE

To change a verb depending on **who** is doing the action or **when** it's being done

e.g. Conjugate the verb "comer" in the preterite tense:

Comí - I ate

Comiste - You ate

Comió - He/she ate

Comimos - we ate

Comisteis - you lot ate

Comieron - they ate
